3. What did the annual sacrifices accomplish? (Hebrews 10:3)
4. What is impossible? (Hebrews 10:4) See also Hebrews 9:12.
5. With what was God not pleased? How did Christ remedy that? (Hebrews 10:5-9) See also John 4:34 and Luke 22:42
6. What did Jesus accomplish for us “by that will?” (Hebrews 10:10)
7. The priest does what “day after day?” What is the result? (Hebrews 10:11)
8. How was Jesus different? (Hebrews 10:12-14)
9. To what does the Holy Spirit testify? (Hebrews 10:15-18)
10. Why do we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place? (Hebrews 10:19-21) See also Matthew 27:50-51
11. There are three attributes of our spiritual life that allow us to draw near to God. What are they? (Hebrews 10:22)
12. We are exhorted to do five things because Jesus has reconciled us to the Father. What are they? (Hebrews 10:22-25)
13. One commentator has called this section of chapter 10 the “triad of faith, hope and love.” Research the following verses to discover the truth he points to.
  - a. 1 Thessalonians 1:3

  20. To which group do believers belong? (Hebrews 10:39)
